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Lede Family Wines

Lede Family Wines encompasses two distinct wine brands, a luxury hotel, and over 200 acres of exceptional vineyards in Northern California. Cliff Lede Vineyards, with its flagship Cabernet Sauvignon *Poetry* and various Bordeaux-style wines, is located in the Stags Leap District of Napa Valley. FEL Wines produces estate-driven wines from the renowned Savoy Vineyard as well as appellation and vineyard-designate bottlings from the Anderson Valley. Finally, Poetry Inn Napa Valley is a five-suite luxury hotel perched above the Cliff Lede Poetry Vineyard offering guests world-class hospitality and unparalleled views of the valley below.

A strategic thinker and visionary, Cliff Lede (pronounced lay-dee) is the driving force of Lede Family wines, a dynamic wine company that strives for excellence in all aspects. For over 20 years, Cliff has applied his ability to identify opportunities and employ the talent required to be successful in building a portfolio of estate vineyards, wineries, and properties with authenticity, luxury, and sustainability in mind.

Cliff Lede Vineyards

Cliff Lede Vineyards was founded in 2002 by Cliff Lede following the acquisition of 60 acres in the Stags Leap District of Napa Valley. With a focus on producing wines from estate vineyards, Cliff engaged industry experts to redesign and replant the majority of the estate. The plantings were so specific and precise to each soil type and exposure that, to keep track without having to refer to a clipboard, Cliff decided to name each block after some of his favorite rock songs and albums. From “My Generation” to “Dark Side of the Moon,” he created what is known today as the Cliff Lede Vineyards “Rock Blocks.” The winemaking team gets creative with this innovation, annually crafting a small-lot Rock Block Series “mash up” of two or more blocks, featured in the tasting room and wine club.

Farmed by Director of Vineyard Operations Allison Wilson and her team, the estate is split into two distinct vineyards in the northern corner of the Stags Leap District appellation. The steep, southwest-facing hillside vineyard that surrounds Poetry Inn is the Poetry Vineyard. It reaches from the valley floor up to the highest elevations of the appellation. This site is composed of a combination of shallow volcanic soils on top of fractured shale, which produces extremely concentrated berries. This iconic vineyard is the sole source for the winery’s flagship Cabernet Sauvignon, Poetry. Next to the hillside, The Twin Peaks Estate vineyard sits on the valley floor surrounding the tasting room and winery. The soil is predominantly gravelly loam thanks to the two rocky hillsides on the vineyard’s southern border. The plantings on Twin Peaks Estate include Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, Malbec, Sauvignon Blanc, and Sémillon.

The modern winery, designed by world-renowned architect Howard Backen and completed in 2005, combines time-tested techniques with innovative technology. The winery utilizes a three-tier sorting line including an optical sorting machine, which sorts grapes based upon fully customizable settings. A custom crane system gently delivers the berries to stainless steel tank by gravity before fermentation. In 2011, a 300-kilowatt solar panel field was installed to power the winery and nearby administration building. Wastewater is captured for irrigation and an extensive cave system provides a naturally cool space for wines to age. Since 2015, the winery has been Napa Green Certified sustainable.

Cliff Lede Vineyards' production is overseen by Director of Winemaking Christopher Tynan and Winemaker Travis Bullard. Wines produced include Sauvignon Blanc, Napa Valley; Cabernet Sauvignon, Stags Leap District; Cabernet Sauvignon, Beckstoffer To Kalon Vineyard; the Rock Block Series, Stags Leap District; Songbook, Napa Valley; and the flagship wine, Poetry, Stags Leap District, among others that are offered only to wine club members.

FEL Wines

In 2011, Cliff Lede expanded his estate vineyard holdings into Pinot Noir and Chardonnay following the purchase of the Savoy Vineyard in Anderson Valley. In 2014, as a tribute to his mother, Florence Elsie Lede, Cliff released the first vintages of FEL Wines. After all, it was she whose home winemaking hobby sparked his curiosity in wine when he was a teenager.

The organically farmed Savoy Vineyard is recognized as one of the benchmark Pinot Noir and Chardonnay vineyards in North America. This southwest facing, gently sloping vineyard was planted by Richard Savoy in 1991 near the junction of Gowan Creek and the Navarro River. Encompassing 44 acres, it is planted to a diverse array of Dijon and California heritage Pinot Noir and Chardonnay clones, and is divided into 34 sub-blocks, which are each managed individually to maximize quality. Cliff continues the tradition of selling fruit from the Savoy Vineyard to other premier California Pinot Noir producers, including Littorai, Radio-Coteau, Failla, and Williams Selyem. Likewise, the team at FEL Wines purchases fruit from other outstanding vineyards in the Anderson Valley, including Ferrington and Wendling, to craft their portfolio of vineyard designate and appellation tier wines.

In 2018, FEL Wines opened the doors to their own winemaking facility located in Sonoma. Open top stainless-steel fermenters, custom made wooden cuves, oval shaped casks, and neutral French oak barrels are all utilized to craft the various FEL wines. The winery also includes a Champagne-style press that is used to gently extract the juices for Chardonnay production.

FEL Wines' production is overseen by Director of Winemaking Ryan Hodgins and Winemaker Sarah Green. The full array of wines includes Anderson Valley Pinot Noir, Anderson Valley Chardonnay, Anderson Valley Pinot Gris, Savoy Vineyard Pinot Noir, Savoy Vineyard "Heritage Clones" Pinot Noir, Savoy Vineyard Chardonnay, Ferrington Vineyard Pinot Noir, and Wendling Vineyard Pinot Noir.

Tasting and Visiting

Guests may taste wines from Cliff Lede Vineyards and FEL Wines inside the 1913 Craftsman-style tasting room in Yountville, also redesigned by Howard Backen.

The tasting room at Cliff Lede Vineyards offers something for any discerning visitor; meticulously crafted estate-driven wines, outdoor seating with breathtaking views, museum-quality art throughout the property, and awesome music. Reserved Table tastings are available from \$60 per person and feature five current releases from Cliff Lede and FEL Wines. Collectors may opt for the views and comfort of The VIP tasting, which features single vineyard, appellation, Platinum, or library wines from Cliff Lede Vineyards and FEL Wines from \$90 per person. Elevated tastings are also hosted in the Backstage Tasting Lounge, which features rotating exhibits from well-known artists, as well as music memorabilia, from \$90 per person. Private tastings and tours of the winery are available with advance reservation. All experiences are available by appointment only.

Poetry Inn Napa Valley

Since its opening in 2005, the sophisticated and secluded Poetry Inn Napa Valley has quietly stood as an oasis of privacy and serenity. Accessible exclusively to registered guests by way of a steep, gated drive, it is the ultimate wine country sanctuary for those seeking privacy with the tailored service of a personal concierge.

The Howard Backen-designed property is revered for its five spacious suites, each of which measures a generous 950 to 1,450 square feet. Suites are appointed with wood-burning fireplaces, ample bathrooms built of Beauharnais Rose limestone and Palladina Marmo Giallo Reale marble, deep soaking tubs and double vanities, and west-facing private terraces that offer breathtaking views of the Napa Valley below.

In 2021, the interior aesthetic was reimagined by the creative minds of St. Helena based Erin Martin Design. Erin and her team worked with a *mélange* of textures and natural materials in order to create a stimulating and modern, yet comfortable, contrast to Poetry Inn's timeless Napa elegance. Guests will discover accents of greenery, decorative surprises, and unique art in each suite.

Each of the Inn's suites, which are themed after famous poets such as Emily Dickinson and Robert Frost, were further imbued with a unique nod to their respective namesake poets through decorative artwork by artist Michael Duté who was invited to use Poetry Inn's walls as his canvas. For example, the Robert Louis Stevenson suite's walls are adorned with stanzas from "My Shadow," and the Robert Frost suite features a mural of the woods from "The Road not Taken," bringing the poems to life and adding a personal touch to each suite.

All stays at Poetry Inn include an indulgent multi-course breakfast created by Executive Chef Lynn Vita using seasonal ingredients from the property's garden and local farms. Guests may enjoy breakfast in the main lounge or on the outdoor patio, surrounded by picturesque views of the valley floor. Groups renting the whole inn may choose to partake in meals in the central lounge or on the Sunset Terrace. Poetry Inn also serves wines from the Cliff Lede Vineyards and FEL Wines portfolios through the property's private cellar. Poetry Inn's treatment room is one of the most tranquil and intimate spaces in all of wine country. Therapists can be booked for massages, facials, and a host of other treatments.

In the interest of adult guests seeking a tranquil and romantic environment, Poetry Inn is not an appropriate place for pets, or for children under the age of 16. Parties may reserve the whole property by contacting the innkeepers, and minimum stay requirements may apply. Individual room rates range from \$1,085 (low season weekday) to \$3,940 (high season weekend.)

Additional Vineyard and Winery Holdings

In addition to the 60 acres of vines in Stags Leap District and the 44-acre Savoy Vineyard in Anderson Valley, the Lede Family Wines estate includes 20 acres in Calistoga and 86 acres in Carneros.

Acquired in 2013 and located at the base of Diamond Mountain, the 20-acre Calistoga vineyard estate has is planted mostly to Cabernet Sauvignon, with a small block of Sauvignon Blanc. The gravelly loam soils are volcanic in origin with alluvial influence made evident by copious amounts of water-rolled gravel and large cobbles. While Calistoga can experience quite hot daytime temperatures, the vineyard is protected from the hot afternoon sun by Diamond Mountain to the west.

The 86-acre Carneros vineyard was added in 2019. The vineyard is comprised of clay and loam-based soils and boasts an exposed flat section on the east side and rolling hills to the west with a predominantly southwest-exposure. The lower lying flat section was replanted to Bordeaux white varieties, Pinot Noir, and Chardonnay in 2020. The adjacent hills, also replanted in 2020, feature a mix of Bordeaux red varieties including Cabernet Franc, Merlot, and Cabernet Sauvignon.

In 2019, Lede Family Wines entered its first international wine venture by partnering with Mas Doix wines in the Priorat DOQ of Spain. Established in 1998 by the Llagostera family, Mas Doix is a premier producer of old-vine Grenache and Carignan. The estate vineyards have plantings dating back to 1902 and are located around the town of Poboleda. In 2019, a new winery and tasting room was constructed just in time for harvest. The Mas Doix portfolio includes single varietal and red blends of Grenache and Carignan, and white wines composed of White Grenache, Macabeu, and Pedro Ximénez.

Cliff Lede

Since founding his namesake winery in 2002, Cliff Lede (pronounced lay-dee) has put every emphasis towards creating a modern and diversified world-class estate. A strategic thinker and visionary, Lede is the driving force of a company that at once holds the values of the great Old World winemaking properties, with the energy, youth, and spark of the New World. His wines are intrinsically connected to the land, yet his viewpoint is forward-thinking and entirely fresh. One visit to the Cliff Lede Vineyards property, which is full of contemporary art and is juxtaposed with vineyard blocks named for classic rock songs, and it is clear that to him, wine—like music and art—is a source of great beauty.

Lede grew up involved with his family's successful construction business in Canada, and first discovered the splendor of the Napa Valley while on a business retreat in the 1990s. An avid long-distance runner, he explored the back roads of Napa Valley throughout his trip. The area resonated a great deal with him, as he had collected Bordeaux wines since his late 20s. Frequent return visits ensued, and he was soon exposed to everything Napa Valley has to offer: beautiful land, some of the world's greatest restaurants, and a core of friendly, passionate, and hardworking people that reminded him of his own community.

Lede soon began searching for a property in Napa where he could start a winery. Determined to plant his roots in the Stags Leap District for its complex and age-worthy wines, he remained patient and focused. Upon learning that a Stags Leap District estate was for sale, Cliff seized the opportunity and established Cliff Lede Vineyards. One year later, the southwest facing hillside just above the Silverado Trail became available. Following the acquisition of the rare hillside property, Cliff named it the Poetry Vineyard. In 2005, he opened Poetry Inn, one of Napa's most secluded luxury boutique hotels, perched high above the valley floor overlooking the winery and vineyards. In 2009, he expanded to include cooler-climate varieties from the Anderson Valley as his love for creating things led to the purchase of the Savoy Vineyard and the creation of a new brand, FEL, named for his mother, Florence Elsie Lede.

Tony Baldini
President and COO

Tony Baldini is the President and Chief Operating Officer of Lede Family Wines, encompassing Cliff Lede Vineyards and FEL Wines. Tony joined Lede Family Wines in 2020 after nearly a decade at Hahn Family Wines, where he served as the company's Chief Executive Officer. He began his career at Hahn as General Manager in 2011. In time, Tony rose to President, and ultimately President and CEO where he oversaw sales, marketing, finance, winegrowing, and operations for the company. During his tenure at Hahn, Tony drove the repositioning of the company into one of the Central Coast's top estate producers with sourcing stretching from the cool Santa Lucia Highlands to Paso Robles.

Prior to Hahn, Tony served as a brand manager for luxury wine brands in the Constellation Wines portfolio, such as the Napa Valley's Franciscan Estate and Mount Veeder Winery. Before Constellation, Tony held marketing roles at Don Sebastiani & Sons and Jackson Family Wines.

Tony grew up in the Napa Valley. His father was a longtime vineyard manager who planted some of Trefethen's original vineyards. Tony holds a BA in economics from the University of California at Davis and an MBA from the University of California at Berkeley, Haas School of Business. He lives in Napa with his wife, Caroline, and their two children.

Jason Lede
Director of Communications

As Director of Communications, Jason Lede publicly represents Lede Family Wines and focuses on deepening the company's relationships with trade, media, consumers, employees, and the community. He works closely with his father, Cliff Lede, to build upon the family's 20-year foundation and helps chart the future of the organization by enhancing existing sustainability efforts and developing new company-wide goals and programs.

Jason was drawn to the wine business shortly after his father founded Cliff Lede Vineyards in 2002. As a teenager, he traded summers at his home in Edmonton, Canada, for work at the winery. Jason's decision to pursue a career in wine came after completing his first harvest internship at Cliff Lede Vineyards in 2007. Aspiring to join the family winery, he developed a ten-year plan with his father that included earning a BS in Business Administration from the University of San Francisco, an MBA from the University of Alberta, and an Advanced Wine Certificate from the International Sommelier Guild. To supplement his studies, he worked the 2010 harvest in Australia, then spent three years at an independent wine retailer, importer, and distributor in Canada. Jason officially joined Lede Family Wines in 2015 and spent four years overseeing wholesale sales across several states before managing hospitality operations for two years.

Jason serves on the board of the Stags Leap District Winegrowers Association and is actively involved with various Napa Valley Vintners Committees. Like his father Cliff, he's an avid music lover and can be found giving back to the community through charitable DJing at Napa Valley's best parties. Jason lives with his wife and son in the town of Yountville.

Christopher Tynan
Director of Winemaking, Cliff Lede Vineyards and Poetry

Christopher Tynan's self-taught, avant-garde approach to winemaking is a style that pays tribute to both tradition and innovation. His exacting philosophy of only employing low-yield vines from select sites, and minimal intervention in the winery, ensures that each bottle expresses the distinct nuances of each site, block, and vintage.

Born in New York and raised in Texas, Christopher Tynan began his wine career in the vineyard, working summers doing irrigation management for vineyards across Napa and Sonoma counties. Following a harvest at Cain Vineyard & Winery in 2004, he was given an opportunity to work the 2005 harvest with the renowned winemaking and viticulture team of Helen Turley and John Wetlaufer at Blankiet Estate in Yountville. In 2006, he became the assistant winemaker at the prestigious Colgin Cellars on Pritchard Hill. At Colgin, Christopher worked closely with Vintner Ann Colgin, Winemaker Allison Tauziet, and Vineyard Manager David Abreu for the next five years. It was here where he learned and embodied the standard for excellence in all aspects of winemaking and viticulture. Christopher brought his wealth of knowledge and meticulous attention to detail to Cliff Lede Vineyards after accepting the position of Winemaker in 2012.

Christopher lives in Coombsville with his wife Katie and their black Labrador Bacchus. In his free time Christopher enjoys traveling, cooking, and collecting wine.

Travis Bullard
Winemaker, Cliff Lede Vineyards

As winemaker at Cliff Lede Vineyards, Travis Bullard works alongside director of winemaking Christopher Tynan to oversee day-to-day winemaking operations and the management of the wine production team. In addition to working in the cellar, Travis represents the winery at key trade and consumer events.

Travis moved to Napa Valley in 2010 to pursue an internship at Cliff Lede Vineyards. From first taste, he fell in love with the Cliff Lede portfolio of wines and knew he wanted to specialize in Napa Cabernet Sauvignon. Upon completion of his internship, Travis joined the team as a full-time lab technician. In 2012, he was promoted to enologist, and by 2013, he was promoted to associate winemaker—the same year that Cliff Lede Vineyards received its first 100-point score. In 2021, Travis was named winemaker.

A native of Santa Cruz, California, Travis completed a BA in Agricultural Business from California Polytechnic Institute, San Luis Obispo, in 2008. While studying there, he was introduced to the dynamic wine culture of Paso Robles and the Central Coast through participation in the on-campus wine club and volunteer opportunities at local wine events, such as Hospice du Rhône. Travis gained valuable and diverse experience through internships in the lab and cellar at wineries such as Korbel and Sonoma Cutrer in Sonoma and Summerwood in Paso Robles where he was fortunate to work under noted winemaker Jeff Cohn.

Travis lives on a historic vineyard adjacent to Cliff Lede Vineyards in Yountville with his wife and their three sons. Outside of winemaking, he enjoys playing golf, traveling, and anything athletic.

Allison Wilson
Director of Vineyard Operations, Cliff Lede Vineyards

As Director of Vineyard Operations at Napa Valley-based Cliff Lede Vineyards, Allison Wilson is responsible for overseeing all farming and redevelopment of the winery's three estate vineyards in the Stags Leap District, Carneros, and Calistoga AVAs. She works closely with the internal winemaking team to develop and implement the vineyard department's farming protocols, while also managing all of Cliff Lede Vineyards' external grower relations.

A native of Contra Costa County, California, Allison's introduction to grape growing was through harvest celebrations and weekend visits to her great uncle's nearby Livermore Valley vineyard, cementing her interest in agriculture from a young age. After graduating California Polytechnic University as a Fruit Science major in 2012, Allison jump-started her career in Napa as assistant viticulturist at Renteria Vineyard Management, where she eventually worked her way up to become viticulturist in 2014. Eager to cultivate her career, owner Oscar Renteria encouraged Allison to join the Napa Valley Grapegrowers Association to deepen her ties within Napa Valley. This opportunity with the Grapegrowers ultimately led her to meet the team at Cliff Lede Vineyards. In January of 2015, Allison was hired as viticulturist and, in 2018, she became director of vineyard operations.

Allison is still involved with the Napa Valley Grapegrowers and is currently the chair of the Marketing and Communications Committee. Additionally, Allison serves on the Cultural Practices Industry Review Committee for the American Vineyard Foundation and is a California Licensed Pest Control Advisor. In her free time, Allison enjoys spending time with her dog and teaching yoga.

Ryan Hodgins
Director of Winemaking, FEL Wines and Savoy Vineyard

Ryan Hodgins is the Director of Winemaking for FEL Wines, which produces Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, and Pinot Gris from vineyards in the Anderson Valley.

Raised in the Pacific Northwest, Hodgins attended Oberlin College in Ohio, where he often had conversations with his plant biology professor about winegrowing. Though he explored a few careers upon graduation, his interest in wine was piqued, and he soon relocated to California and enrolled in the Master's program at U.C. Davis and graduated with a degree in Viticulture & Enology. As a means of researching the topic for his thesis, Pinot Noir tannins in the Willamette Valley, Hodgins got his first hands-on vineyard experience while working harvest at Witness Tree Vineyard in Salem, Oregon. Upon graduation in 2004, he spent a year gaining experience in other regions at wineries such as Acacia Vineyard in Napa, where he served as harvest enologist, and Krishna Valley Winery in India, where he served as visiting winemaker.

In 2005, Hodgins returned to the United States and accepted a full-time position as assistant winemaker and viticulturist at Hanzell Vineyards, a role that helped hone his expertise in Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from Sonoma. While at Hanzell, Hodgins also worked as the founding consulting winemaker for Breggo Cellars in the Anderson Valley. The Lede family's acquisition of Breggo Cellars (now FEL) in 2009 allowed Hodgins to become full-time winemaker. The Lede Family purchased the Savoy Vineyard in 2011, a benchmark vineyard in the Anderson Valley, giving Hodgins access to his first estate vineyard.

Hodgins has a strong connection to the region and to his vineyards. He spends much of his time in the vineyards and exercises a hands-off approach in the winery, in favor of letting each vineyard and each block speak in the bottle. Both Hodgins and Cliff Lede share the same vision for FEL Wines: to create an exciting portfolio of wines that are complex and elegant with pronounced acidity and the ability to age well.

On the rare days that he is not in the winery or walking the vineyards, Hodgins spends time in the garden with his wife and three children, feeding their appreciation for Mother Nature and agriculture.

Sarah Green
Winemaker, FEL Wines

Sarah Green is the Winemaker for FEL Wines, producing Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Gris from Mendocino County's Anderson Valley. An English major who grew up with a love of literature, Sarah feels a literary connection to winemaking; every wine and vineyard has both content and style, its own language and narrative.

Born and raised in Southern California, Sarah earned a BA in English from Smith College in 2011. Sarah's interest in wine was sparked when she encountered a winemaker in her school's alumnae network. After a brief correspondence and a family trip to wine country, Sarah was filled with a sense of curiosity and adventure around the wine industry.

Upon her graduation from Smith, Sarah worked her first harvest at Donelan Family Wines in Santa Rosa and was instantly captivated by the world of winemaking. At the conclusion of her internship, she worked consecutive harvests in New Zealand, the Sonoma Coast, and Margaret River, Western Australia. In 2013, Sarah returned to Sonoma, where she spent the next four years as Assistant Winemaker at Donelan. In 2017, Sarah joined the team at FEL Wines as Associate Winemaker. She was drawn to working with FEL's excellent fruit sources, especially the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from its renowned estate, Savoy Vineyard – and to the challenge of building out FEL's brand new winery space. In 2021, she was promoted to Winemaker, where she continues to work alongside Director of Winemaking Ryan Hodgins.

Sarah resides in Petaluma and in her free time she can be found completing her MBA in Wine Business at Sonoma State University and, in every spare moment, hiking.

Dina Clark
Vice President, Wholesale

Dina Clark is the senior director of national sales for Cliff Lede Vineyards in the Stags Leap District and FEL Wines in the Anderson Valley. In her role, Clark oversees the sales and distribution for both brands, working closely with long-time sales executive Sara Gorr.

Clark brings nearly 25 years of wine industry experience to Lede Family Wines. Most recently, she served as Midwest regional director of sales for the Boisset Collection, where she oversaw the company's American and French portfolio of wines totaling 21 brands in ten states with 18 distributors. Prior to that, Clark spent nearly a decade with Terlato Wines International, where she held positions including national accounts manager, national hotel manager and then director of sales for the Terlato Distell Artisan spirits division of the company.

A graduate of Northern Illinois University, Dina resides in the Chicago area where she enjoys spending time with her three children, cooking and staying active through cycling.

Lede Family Wines Timeline

2002: The Lede Family purchases sixty acres and a winery in Napa Valley's Stags Leap District, establishing Cliff Lede Vineyards.

2004: The new Backen Gillam-designed tasting room, a renovated 1913 Craftsman-style bungalow, opens for wine tasting. Famed viticulturist David Abreu begins replanting the estate vineyards.

2005: The new state-of-the art, 25,000 square foot winery and cave system is completed just in time to receive the 2005 harvest. Designed by world-renowned architect Howard Backen, the luxurious five-room Poetry Inn opens to guests, offering valley-wide views from its perch above the hillside Poetry Vineyard.

2011: The Lede Family acquires the Savoy Vineyard, a benchmark vineyard for Anderson Valley Pinot Noir and Chardonnay.

2013: The Lede family acquires a 20-acre vineyard in Calistoga, which is planted mostly to Cabernet Sauvignon and a small amount of Sauvignon Blanc.

2014: FEL Wines is created to honor of Cliff's mother, Florence Elsie Lede. The first releases from FEL are the 2012 FEL Pinot Noir Anderson Valley and the 2012 FEL Chardonnay Anderson Valley. The "Lede Family Wines" name is created to tie together the sister brands, showing the relationship between their complementary portfolios and the shared commitment to quality as part of a family-owned winery.

2015: Cliff Lede Vineyards' Stags Leap District estate achieves both Napa Green Land and Napa Green Winery certification.

2018: FEL Wines opens a state-of-the-art winery, specifically designed for the production of high-quality Pinot Noir and Chardonnay.
